

International Scientific and Diplomatic Congress "Yalta Peace: Historical Experience and Prospects" (Moscow — Yalta — Sevastopol, October 5-9, 2020)

PRESS RELEASE

International Scientific and Diplomatic Congress "Yalta Peace: Historical Experience and Prospects" will be dedicated to the 75th anniversary of the Yalta Conference, the establishment of the UN and the UNESCO, and will be held on October 5–9, 2020 in Moscow, Yalta and Sevastopol by the Pitirim Sorokin — Nikolai Kondratieff International Institute (SKII) in conjunction with the Lomonosov Moscow State University, the Scientific Council of the Russian Academy of Sciences on Comprehensive Eurasian Economic Integration, Modernization, Competitiveness and Sustainable Development, and the V.I. Vernadsky Crimean Federal University with the assistance of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Russian Federation and with the support of the Presidential Grants Fund.

International Scientific and Diplomatic Congress will discuss the historical rift the mankind has been caught in as a result of the era end and the dynamics of the development of world and local civilizations. The market capitalist world is degrading, and it is being replaced by a humanistic noospheric civilization with a planned market socially responsible economy. The fourth civilizational generation involving the hegemony of the Western countries is turning into the fifth one to be dominated by the East.

The global crisis is coming on, the financial situation of billions of people is declining, they are concerned about their future, the risks of environmental disasters and a self-destructive clash of civilizations are increasing. In these conditions, scientists are urged to comprehend the ongoing changes, to identify the causes of the global crisis and ways of its resolution, as well as outline the future world and determine its structuring strategies. This is the very mission of the Congress.

The Congress will be based on a fundamental scientific proof, a new vision of the trend and prospects for civilization development, a deep analysis of the historical lessons of the Second World War and the Yalta Conference. It is aimed against history rewriting, at revealing the true causes and consequences of the Second World War. In addition, the Congress will highlight the crucial influence of the Yalta and other conferences by the leaders of the three great powers in the Anti-Hitler coalition and the significance of the Yalta Peace, which enabled the establishment of a universal United Nations and prevention of a new global catastrophe, which may come to be the last in the nuclear age.

The attention of the Congress participants will be drawn to the disastrous consequences of the Yalta Peace destruction and the growing US pursuance of the global leadership. The Congress will consider the global crisis of the early XXI century as civilizational, caused by the change of very-long-term civilizational cycles, and will determine its resolution prospects on the grounds of the stable multipolar world order formation supported by the partnership of civilizations and led by the UN.

It will discuss the possibility of "Yalta-2.0" in terms of the prospects for reaching a new comprehensive agreement on the current world order by the leaders of the states being permanent members of the UN Security Council, increasing the strategic orientation and efficiency of the UN system, strengthening the strategic cooperation of integration associations and the efforts of civic institutions.

It will demonstrate the defining role of the dialogue and partnership of civilizations in the fields of science, education, culture and ethics led by UNESCO in order to form moral principles in the establishment of a humanistic noospheric society and the Yalta Peace-2.

The following global projects and proposals will be discussed:

• holding conferences of the leaders of states being permanent members of the UN Security Council in 2021–2025 providing discussions of the main challenges to the world crisis resolution and the Yalta Peace-2 evolvement, and the subsequent approval of the proposed measures by the UN Security Council and the UN General Assembly;

• discussion of the draft UNESCO Universal Declaration "On the Dialogue and Partnership of Civilizations in the Fields of Science, Education, Culture and Ethics" at the 41st General Conference of UNESCO dedicated to the 20th anniversary of the UN General Assembly Resolution "Global Agenda for the Dialogue of Civilizations" and the UNESCO Universal Declaration "On Cultural Diversity";

• preparation and holding of the UN conference "Rio+30" in 2022, discussion of sustainable multipolar world order development strategy 2030 with amending and extending this strategy every five years.

The main outcomes of the Congress will be published in the collection of documents and materials "The Yalta Conference and the Yalta Peace", the report "Global Civilization Crisis – 2020 – Starting Transition to a New Era of History", fundamental monographs "Theory and Strategy for the Establishment of a Sustainable Multipolar World Order Based on Partnership Between Civilizations ("Yalta Peace-2")", "The Strategy of the Dialogue and Partnership of Civilizations in the Fields of Science, Education, Culture and Ethics Led by UNESCO", three issues of the international scientific and educational journal "Partnership of Civilizations", and will be posted on the scientific and educational website "The Yalta Peace" in Russian and English.
